About A-T in adults

An introduction to ataxia-telangiectasia and the work of the A-T Society





What is A-T?*

A-T is a degenerative condition, which causes increasingly severe disability and a reduced life expectancy. Currently there is no cure and only limited treatment options.

People with A-T will have problems with their balance and coordination and as their condition deteriorates most will need to use a wheelchair. The condition also affects the immune system, resulting in a much higher risk of cancer and often leading to lung infections. Fatigue (being constantly tired) can make even small movements difficult while slurred speech can make it hard to be understood (although there are no learning difficulties).

A-T is usually diagnosed during childhood. However some people are not diagnosed until later in life. This is usually because these people have a variant form of A-T, where symptoms may appear later, develop more slowly and/or be less severe. This form of A-T is rarer and there is much that we still don't know about it.

*A-T stands for Ataxia-Telangiectasia, but, because the name is rather difficult to remember (Telangiectasia is pronounced tell-ange-ek-tasia), we usually just say A-T.

How does A-T affect lives?

The impact of A-T on individuals and families is devastating. One in 200 people unknowingly carries the A-T gene, and in almost every case the diagnosis will come out of the blue. As people move through life their condition will deteriorate and they will need more medical care, as well as extra support from their families. Young adults may also become more isolated as their peers go off into the world and they are left behind. Depression and social isolation is common. Independent living may only be possible with lots of support.

About the A-T Society
